

SUBJECT: DUTCH EVACUEES WHO ARRIVED IN BRISBANE
PRIOR TO 15.11.1945

REFERENCE: G.129/E and G.129/R

I have to report and furnish herewith a list giving particulars of Dutch Evacuees who arrived in Brisbane from the Netherlands East Indies prior to the 15.11.1945.

2. It was arranged that these evacuees be permitted to remain in Australia for a period of six (6) months and were then to be repatriated by the Dutch Authorities, but owing to illness of some of the evacuees and transport difficulties, the Authorities have been unable to carry out this contract within the prescribed time.
3. Major Grevas in charge of N.I.W.O.E. at New Farm requests that permission be granted to the evacuees in question to remain here until in a fit condition to travel, or when transport is available.
4. It is expected that the hospital ship "TASMAN" carrying evacuees returning to the N.E.I. will leave Australia at the end of this month and be followed shortly afterwards by the "BLOEMFONTEIN" proceeding to Holland.
5. This list includes Karel and Elisabeth RIEDEL (German) who are being repatriated to Holland. Their case has been dealt with on file G1747/Z.

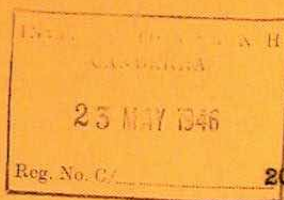



- Subjects have been employed at Camp Columbia for varying periods and are not adversely recorded with this Service, although certain of them were suspected (without definite proof being secured) of being more or less unwilling collaborators with the Japanese prior to their capture and arrival in Australia.
- Subjects are to travel under orders of the N.E.I. Government in Australia, but have not been provided with Passports or other documents of Identity. Customs are prepared to permit them to depart without being in possession of Passports, and the Dutch Consul and Customs have been advised by this Service that in the circumstances no security objection will be raised to the granting of an Exit Permit.
- The matter is reported to you for information, and is considered as having no particular significance except as showing the continued and complete disregard of the Dutch authorities for the National Security (Passports) Regulations. It is pleasing to note, however, that despite the attitude of the N.E.I. Government authorities at their Headquarters, the Dutch Consulate in Brisbane is now co-operating very well with this Service, and is giving notice of any proposed departures well in advance.

SUBJECT: DUTCH CIVILIANS DEPARTING OVERSEAS.

From the issue of the Sydney "Sunday Sun" dated 13th instant it is noted that Misses Darya COLLIN, Edmee MONOD and Alison LEE propose to "return again to make a second tour of New Guinea to entertain troops".

2. Abovenamed are three of the five women passengers referred to in this office's memoranda to you dated 10th and 26th March 1945. It will be remembered that in company with two others (Misses Audrey Campbell BARROW and Elaine Alys HAXTON) they visited Merauke without passports or exit permits, and when questioned at Archerfield airport on the way north were stated by a Dutch Liaison Officer to be Dutch Nurses, members of the Forces, and therefore not liable to be in possession of passports.

3. In the earlier of the above memoranda your instructions were asked for (para 7), but to date no advice has been received at this office.

4. It is now proposed to request Deputy Director, Sydney, to contact the women concerned and to advise them that unless they are properly attested members of the Services, or are in possession of passports and exit permits, they will not be permitted to leave Australia for Dutch New Guinea.

5. If the "New Guinea" referred to should have reference to the Mandated Territory or to Papua, the necessary Entry Permits will be insisted upon.

SUBJECT: DUTCH CIVILIANS DEPARTING OVERSEAS.

From the issue of the "Sunday Sun" dated 13 May 45 it has been ascertained that three women propose shortly to proceed to "New Guinea" to entertain troops.

2. The three mentioned are Misses Darya COLLIN, Edmee MONOD and Alison LEE. The address of the two first named is 17 Rosemount Avenue, Edgecliffe, whilst Miss LEE is stated to reside at 85 Ocean Street, Willoughby (?) (possibly Woollahra).
3. In March of this year the three persons abovenamed, together with two others (Misses Audrey Campbell BARROW and Elaine Alys HAXTON) proceeded to Dutch New Guinea by air. They were without passports or exit permits and on being challenged at Archerfield airport were vouched for by the Dutch Liaison Officer there as "Dutch Army Nurses".
4. When interrogated on their return it was ascertained that this story was a complete falsehood, and that the persons concerned were entertainers, and should of course have been in possession of passports and exit permits.
5. It is requested that you arrange to have subjects informed that should they desire to visit Dutch New Guinea at any future date they will not be permitted to proceed unless they are in possession of passports and exit permits.

Further to this office's memorandum to you (Reference No. G1747/N/ADD of 10 Mar 45) relative to five women passengers who departed for Merauke on 7 Mar 45, it is advised that the persons concerned have now returned to Australia.

2. Copy of Cairns memorandum of 23 Mar 45 (Ref.C/2344) is annexed. In this connection you may wish to have Sydney office enquire from Customs as to whether, and in what circumstances, permission was given for these women to leave Australia without proper Documents of Identity.
3. Security Control Officer, Archerfield, at which airport subjects arrived at 1305 hours on 23rd instant per aircraft V.H. R.D.L., reports as follows:-
 - (a) The following women passengers arrived under the charge of Miss Darya COLLIN - Miss Melanie Edme Monod De FROIDELVILLE. Miss Alice Kathleen LEE (known as Alison LEE). Miss Audrey Campbell BARROW. Miss Elaine Alys HAXTON.
 - (b) The above had proceeded to Merauke to entertain the troops.
 - (c) Two of the girls are Dutch (COLLIN and MONOD) and had their passports taken from them (apparently by the Dutch authorities) and Registration Cards issued.
 - (d) The three Australians travelled under N.E.I. Government orders, and Miss COLLIN who was in charge, said that "Canberra was going to send on particulars to Security Service."
 - (e) The Dutch girls have been in Australia for three years.
 - (f) Four of the girls are entertainers, while the fifth is an Assistant Censor (Miss LEE).

SUBJECT: Dutch Civilians departing overseas

Further to this office's memorandum to you (Ref. No. G.1747/N/ADD of 27 Feb 45), copy to Cairns, a further instance of evasion of security controls by passengers travelling under NEI auspices has now come under notice.

2: The matter was reported by Cairns office under date 7 Mar 45, when it was advised that the undermentioned women passengers were on Dutch aircraft RDM at 1150 on that date en route to Merauke:

Monod de Sroiderville
 (Miss) Barrow
 (Miss) Lee, Allison

Barya Collin
 (Miss) Haxton

3: The two first-mentioned possessed valid Australian passports, but neither visa nor exit permit; the three others had no documents whatever. All claimed to be members of an Entertainment Unit proceeding to Merauke, where they were to reside at the Dutch Residency until their return to Australia about 17 Mar 45. All names were correctly shown on aircraft manifest.

4: As the pilot of the aircraft was impatient to depart from Cairns on schedule, the Airport Control section exercised its discretion and permitted the passengers to proceed. The women stated that before leaving Sydney they had approached the Customs authorities and had been told that "as they were travelling on a military aircraft and on a journey of a military nature, they did not require visaed passports or exit permits".

5: If the above statement is correct, it discloses an extraordinary attitude on the part of Customs, Sydney; and you may feel disposed to pursue this matter further if the women will substantiate their statements on their return.

6: An explanation was sought by this office as to why these women were permitted to leave Archerfield airport without having their papers inspected. Cpl. PAUL, Security Control officer at Archerfield, has reported as follows: "Mr. CARTER, Dutch Air Liaison officer, advised me on 6 Mar of the forthcoming departure to Merauke on 7 Mar of a/c RDM. He further stated that there were five women leaving on the plane, Dutch nurses proceeding to Dutch New Guinea. I accepted the Dutch Air Liaison Officer's statement as being the truth, and did not check their identification papers".

7: It is submitted that there is far too much laxity on the part of the Dutch authorities who are responsible for the Merauke service, and that the only way of bringing home to them their responsibilities under the A.S. Regulations regarding Passports, Exit Permits etc., is to refuse ANY person the right to depart from an Australian airport unless properly documented. In view, however, of possible exception being taken (on a high plane) if this course is adopted, the matter is submitted to you for instructions

8: Pending receipt of your reply, Cairns and Archerfield will be instructed to check the documents held by these women on their return, but to permit them to land even if not in possession of the required credentials.

SUBJECT: DUTCH CIVILIANS DEPARTING OVERSEAS.

Despite representations previously made to responsible Dutch authorities which resulted in a slight improvement for the time being, various irregularities are now once more occurring in connection with the departure for overseas of Dutch nationals.

2. So far as military personnel are concerned, no difficulty exists, but several instances of civilian passengers proceeding to Merauke by air during the past two months indicates that a further tightening up is necessary.
3. By aircraft C47, R.D.G. which left Brisbane for Merauke via Cairns on 3 Jan 45, Dr. SMITS (Director of Finance to N.E.I. Government) and Mr. LOEBIS (Clerk at N.E.I. HQ) were travellers. Neither of these persons were in possession of a passport, although LOEBIS held a B.1 Alien's Registration Card which was collected by the Security Control Officer at Archerfield prior to his departure.
4. In view of the position held by Dr. SMITS and the fact that the names of the two persons in question were included in the passenger list they were not prevented from departing. Subsequently the matter was taken up through Lieut. Plumb with local Dutch H.Q. here, but N.E.F.I.S. pointed out that these civilians were not under their control, and regretted their inability to do anything to assist.
5. On 16 Feb 45 aircraft R.D.I. (Brisbane to Merauke) had amongst its passengers Dr. NEEB (a senior officer of N.I.C.A.) and MOEKAMAT, a Javanese. These persons were provided with Movement Orders but again were without passports or other proof of their identity with the persons mentioned in the Movement Orders and Passenger Lists.
6. Whilst every endeavour is made not to hold up departing aircraft, and a considerable amount of latitude for the exercise of tact has been permitted to Security Control Officers both at Archerfield and Cairns, the fact remains that the requirement of the National Security Regulations in these cases is that the departing traveller shall be in possession of a passport and exit permit.
7. It is submitted that the matter cannot be dealt with by the local authorities here and that - possibly in association with Customs Branch - it would be more appropriate for this Service's H.Q. to take the matter up with the Dutch Consul-General.

Security Control at Airports - Irregular Dutch arrivals.

Reference is invited to my memorandum to the Director, N.S.I., Brisbane, of the 1st August, wherein a suggestion was made for the appointment of a Netherlands officer to the Security Control Section at Darwin. Copies of the letter in question were sent to addressees of this present memorandum.

2. A reply in the following terms has been received from the Director of N.S.I.:

"The need of a Netherlands Security Officer at Townsville is fully realised. Unfortunately, however, no officer can at present be made available for this assignment.

The following rules for travel from N.S.I. to Australia have, therefore, been made and these will come into effect in the shortest time possible:-

- (a) All N.S.I. military personnel (Naval personnel included) will travel with a movement order, made out in English.
- (b) All non-military personnel (including military personnel on-prisonary of-war) will be provided in Numbuc with an Identification sheet in duplicate - one sheet to go to the Security Service Officer at the airport of destination and the other to HNSB, Columbia Camp, Brisbane.
- (c) Without a movement order or Identification sheet, entry into Austral is forbidden.
- (d) The Captain of the aircraft will collect the necessary papers before taking off from the last airport outside Australian territory. He will be responsible that the papers intended for the Security Service Officer are handed over to that authority and that the papers for HNSB are forwarded to this Headquarters.

It is considered that when this regulation comes into force, complaints regarding unlawful entry within the Commonwealth will be prevented. Instructions to this effect have been issued to all concerned."

3. The above is circulated for information and necessary action. Brisbane and Townsville have already received a copy of the HNSB reply, but should refer reference therein to "Immigration Officer" to read "Security Service Officer".

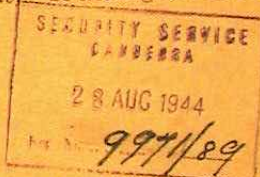

SUBJECT: Javanese Civilians ex Merauke - Arrival
at CAIRNS.

I desire to advise that a Netherlands military aircraft arrived at Cairns from Merauke at 1700 hrs. on 8th August, 44 and in addition to 6 Netherlands Army personnel, it contained the following 11 Javanese civilians:-

Josua Anakotta, Sairan, Jandoe, Moehamad Hamidran, Csan Sepulette,
Doelah Rakain, Rarel Syarookin, Thomas Lalouro, Agapitus Lorfan,
Johannus Doematoeboen, Demon.

None of these civilians was in possession of any form of identification, and the Captain of the aircraft stated they were sent to the aircraft at Merauke by the Netherlands authorities with instructions that they were to be conveyed to Brisbane, this being in accordance with an arrangement made between the Australian and Netherlands authorities.

The only document available was a Passenger List. As the aircraft had only landed for refuelling, there was not sufficient time in which to register these Javanese as aliens and therefore the Passenger List was stamped by the Airport Control Representative and details conveyed immediately by telephone to the Deputy Director, Brisbane, so that the passengers could be dealt with at their next port of call, Brisbane, where they were due to arrive at approximately 2130 hours.

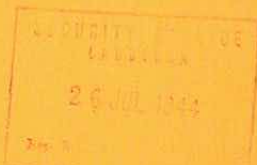

--- As this was received late at night, the Duty Officer contacted Captain HEHIR and the attached report from the latter is submitted herewith.

No advice has yet been received as to whether all the men were classed medically fit and enlisted in the Dutch Navy, but enquiries will be made and a further report submitted.

1. I was informed of the contents of this telegram by the Duty Officer, W.O. HODGES.

2. I came in to the office arriving at 2000 hrs. and took the following action.

- (a) Contacted local Police at St. Kilda, through Det. Cameron, and was informed that no Indonesian aliens had reported.
- (b) I then went to Dutch Naval Barracks at Queen's Mansions, Beaconsfield Parade, St. Kilda and saw the Officer in Charge, Lieut. BLUME.
- (c) I asked him if he had yet received the 10 Indonesians who had left Brisbane at 0837 today by plane en route for Melbourne. He said that they had arrived and were in the house,
- (d) I asked him whether they were civilians or service personnel. He replied that they were civilians ex Merauke and had been sent down here for enlistment in the Dutch Navy. They were to be medically examined on Monday morning and if fit, would be enlisted. Those unfit would be sent back.
- (e) It was pointed out to Lieut. BLUME that the men were aliens and had not registered, nor had the Dutch authorities notified Security Service that they were being brought here. Lieut. BLUME was sorry, the men had arrived unexpectedly. He would arrange that they would not leave the barracks until either enlisted or classified for return. The Dutch Authorities would be responsible for them while here in Melbourne. With this assurance, I left the matter for the week-end.

A Dutch subject recently flew from Heraldsburg to Melbourne in a Dutch bomber and remained undetected in Melbourne until his presence there was disclosed as a result of an application which he made to the Rationing Commission for clothing coupons.

2. Following this incident the Department of External Affairs were requested to impress upon the Netherlands Legation the nature and scope of our aliens control requirements.
3. The Counsellor of the Netherlands Legation has now informed the Department of External Affairs in these terms:

"I have received your letter of January 7th No. 665/3 and wish to inform you that the Netherlands Consul at Melbourne, upon instructions of this Legation, has brought to the attention of the Commanding Officers of the Netherlands Army and Navy in Australia, of the Netherlands Indies Commission for Australia and New Zealand and of the offices of the Netherlands Indies Government Information Service and Netherlands Forces Intelligence Service the necessity for persons of Netherlands nationality arriving in Australia to comply with the provisions of the National Security (Alien Control) Regulations and that in order that these persons shall learn what is required they should present themselves at the Consulate at Melbourne. I have no doubt that the Officers, Commission and others as referred to will fully cooperate in this matter. I trust that in this manner all Netherlands subjects arriving in Australia, in so far as this is possible, will be reached."

2. Following this incident the Department of External Affairs were requested to impress upon the Netherlands Legation the nature and scope of our aliens control requirements.
3. The Counsellor of the Netherlands Legation has now informed the Department of External Affairs in these terms:

"I have received your letter of January 7th No. 685/3 and wish to inform you that the Netherlands Consul at Melbourne, upon instructions of this Legation, has brought to the attention of the Commanding Officers of the Netherlands Army and Navy in Australia, of the Netherlands Indies Commission for Australia and New Zealand and of the offices of the Netherlands Indies Government Information Service and Netherlands Forces Intelligence Service the necessity for persons of Netherlands nationality arriving in Australia to comply with the provisions of the National Security (Alien Control) Regulations and that in order that these persons shall learn what is required they should present themselves at the Consulate at Melbourne. I have no doubt that the Officers, Commission and others as referred to will fully co-operate in this matter. I trust that in this manner all Netherlands subjects arriving in Australia, in so far as this is possible, will be reached."

As it is thought that the best way to overcome this difficulty of checking practices of the kind would be for the Commonwealth to ask the Netherlands Legation to request the Commander of the Netherlands Air Force to conform to Australian requirements where civilians are concerned, the matter is referred to you for favour of the suggested action if you concur.

SUBJECT: Johannes Rodfried WEGNER

REFERENCE:

1. The following facts concerning the entry of the abovenamed into the Commonwealth are forwarded for your information, as it is thought that they disclose a possible avenue for the introduction of agents into Australia:-
- (a) Advice was received at 1200 hours on the 10th December, 1943 from Mr. MADDISON, Immigration and Passports Officer, Melbourne that the abovenamed alien was in Melbourne, having arrived direct from Dutch New Guinea by Dutch Air Force bomber. Mr. MADDISON stated that WEGNER did not know where he had landed in Victoria, but he arrived in the evening of 5th December, 1943. He further informed this office that WEGNER was staying at Scott's Hotel, Collins St., Melbourne and suggested that he be contacted regarding his passport.
 - (b) WEGNER was contacted later that day and was found to be in possession of Dutch Passport No 1389 issued at Palembang, in January, 1939 valid for one year. His passport disclosed that he was born at The Hague, Holland in 1908. He stated that he had been a civilian administrator at Tamahmerah, Boren Digael, Dutch New Guinea for some years.
 - (c) From other sources it was ascertained that the bomber did not fly direct from Dutch New Guinea to Melbourne but left Merauke at 0838 hrs. on the 4th December and landed at Townsville at midday. Luncheon was taken at the aerodrome and the plane later departed for Brisbane, landing at approximately 1930 hrs. The bomber crew and passengers, including some 4 or 5 Australian Army personnel, spent the night at a Hotel in Brisbane, and on the morning of the 5th December, departed for Melbourne and arrived at Essendon aerodrome at 1818 hrs. The plane was not met at Townsville or Brisbane presumably because no information concerning the arrival or the presence on board of a civilian was known by either Security Service, Customs, Immigration or Health Authorities, and therefore the presence of WEGNER in Australia was unknown.
 - (d) After WEGNER had been in Melbourne for some four days, he decided to purchase some items of clothing, and for that purpose approached the Rationing Commission for coupons. The coupons were refused on the grounds that he was not a registered alien and he was advised to visit the Police and register. The Police advised him that he could not complete his registration unless he was the holder of an exemption certificate issued under the Immigration Act, and referred him to the Immigration Department, Melbourne.

On being interviewed by Mr. MADDISON his presence in Melbourne was communicated to this Office.

- (e) The bomber was in charge of 1st Pilot HAGERS, and both the crew and passengers were in Service dress with the exception of WEGNER, who during the trip wore khaki shirt and slacks which naturally would give the impression that he was also a member of the forces.
- (f) WEGNER is to remain in the Commonwealth on vacation for some three or four months and can be contacted at the N.E.I. Commission, Temple Court, Collins St., Melbourne.
- (g) It is not thought that there is anything subversive concerning WEGNER.

2. From the foregoing, it will be clearly seen that the possibility of civilians being introduced into the Commonwealth in this manner without the knowledge of the proper authorities is an actual fact.

3. For your information, it is advised that it was recently thought expedient that the Dutch Authorities here should be requested to bring under the notice of Dutch Nationals in this State the necessity for compliance with them with the provisions of the National Security (Aliens Control) Regulations, and in fact a short note for publication in the journals "Oranje" and "Penjoeloch" was prepared by this office. There is therefore no excuse for the Dutch Authorities not being conversant with this regulation. Further, Mr. MADDISON has, for some time past, been critical of the attitude of the Dutch Authorities here to compliance with Immigration laws.

4. It appears that some action is necessary to ensure that information of persons brought into the Commonwealth in such a manner should be communicated to Security Service, and your instructions on this matter would be appreciated.
