

Pinkenba Wharf Again Barred

THE public and pressmen were again barred from Pinkenba wharf yesterday while H.M.A.S. Kanimbla was being loaded by Dutch personnel.

A similar incident occurred last week when H.M.A.S. Manoora was berthed there.

In place of last week's military guards, a civilian gatekeeper, with an N.E.I. armband, refused admission.

The Kanimbla, which berthed at 7.30 a.m. yesterday, will embark Dutch troops here for the Netherland East Indies. Some troops who travelled in the ship from Sydney are already on board. Picture at left shows Dutch servicemen arriving at Pinkenba Wharf.

Cargo held up for months by the waterside workers' refusal to load Dutch ships was loaded.

A former interstate passenger vessel owned by McIlwraith, McEacharn, Ltd., the ship was used by the Navy during the war as a troop-carrying assault ship.
